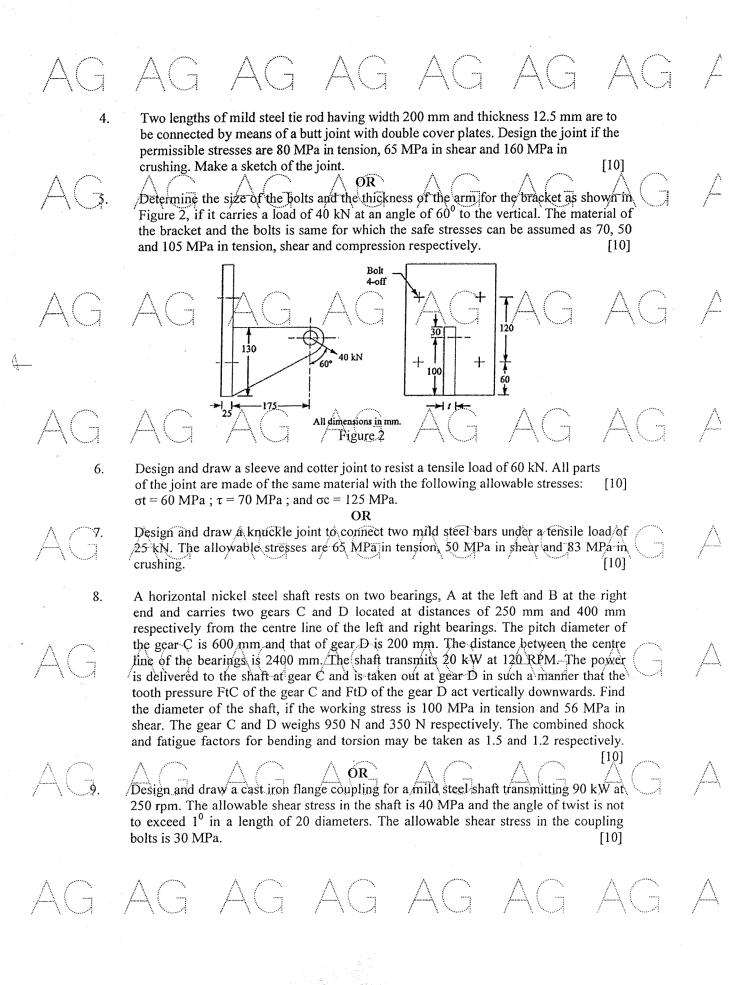

[2] c) Sketch and discuss the various types of welded joints used in pressure vessels. [3] d) How are the keys classified? [2] e) Distinguish between cotter joint and knuckle joint. f) [2] What type of stresses are induced in shafts? g) Why a hollow shaft has greater strength and stiffness than solid shaft of equal weight? h) [3] Classify springs according to their shapes. [2] i) What is the function of a spring? In which type of spring the behavior is non-linear? j) (50 Marks) A mild steel shaft of 50 mm diameter is subjected to a bending moment of 2000 Nm 2. and a torque T. If the yield point of the steel in tension is 200 MPa, find the maximum value of this torque without causing yielding of the shaft according to [10] a) The maximum principal stress b) The maximum shear stress and c) The maximum distortion strain energy theory of yielding. A cantilever beam made of cold drawn carbon steel of circular cross-section as shown 3. in Figure 1, is subjected to a load which varies from - F to 3 F. Determine the maximum load that this member can withstand for an infinite life using a factor of safety as 2. The theoretical stress concentration factor is 1.42 and the notch sensitivity is 0.9. Assume the following values: /Ultimate stress ≠ 550 MPa Yield stress = 470 MPa Endurance limit = 275 MPa

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Design a close coiled helical compression spring for a service load ranging from 10. 2250 N to 2750 N. The axial deflection of the spring for the load range is 6 mm. Assume a spring index of 5. The permissible shear intensity is 420 MPa and modulus of rigidity G = 84 kN/mm². Neglect the effect of stress concentration. Draw a fully dimensioned sketch, showing details of the finish of the end coils. Design and draw a valve spring of a petrol engine for the following operating 11. conditions: Spring load when the valve is open = 400 NSpring load when the valve is closed = 250 NMaximum inside diameter of spring = 25 mm Length of the spring when the valve is open = 40 mm Length of the spring when the valve is closed = 50 mmMaximum permissible shear stress = 400 MPa[10]
