DESCRIPTION OF THE EVENT

The awareness program was conducted in a structured and interactive manner under the supervision of faculty coordinators. The session exclusively addressed issues faced by women in cyberspace and focused on real-life cyber-crime scenarios.

The discussion covered various forms of cyber-crimes, including:

- Online stalking and digital surveillance
- Matrimonial fraud through fake profiles
- Cyber bullying and online abuse
- Social media harassment and misuse of personal information

1. Online Stalking and Digital Surveillance

Online stalking refers to the repeated and unwanted monitoring, tracking, or harassment of individuals through digital platforms. This includes constant messaging, monitoring social media activity, misuse of photographs, GPS tracking, and unauthorized access to personal accounts. The session highlighted how such activities violate personal privacy and can lead to emotional distress and safety concerns. Participants were educated on privacy settings, identifying suspicious behavior, and reporting online stalking through appropriate cyber-crime portals.

2. Matrimonial Fraud through Fake Profiles

Matrimonial fraud involves the creation of fake profiles on matrimonial websites or social media platforms to deceive individuals for financial gain or exploitation. The discussion emphasized how fraudsters manipulate emotions by presenting false identities, fabricated documents, and misleading personal information. Participants were advised to verify profiles carefully, avoid sharing sensitive information, and remain cautious of financial requests made online. The importance of reporting such incidents to cyber-crime authorities was also highlighted.

3. Cyber Bullying and Online Abuse

Cyber bullying refers to the use of digital platforms to intimidate, threaten, or humiliate individuals through abusive messages, offensive comments, or the spread of false information. The session discussed the psychological impact of cyber bullying, including stress, anxiety, and

loss of confidence. Participants were encouraged to block abusive users, preserve evidence, and report incidents to concerned authorities. The program stressed the need for ethical online behavior and mutual respect in digital interactions.

4. Social Media Harassment and Misuse of Personal Information

Social media harassment includes unauthorized sharing of personal photographs, impersonation, offensive tagging, and misuse of private information. The session explained how careless sharing of personal data can lead to serious privacy violations. Participants were guided on safe social media practices, responsible content sharing, and the importance of strong passwords and account security. Awareness was also created about legal remedies available to address such misuse.

Special emphasis was given to **cyber laws related to women's safety**, including the importance of reporting cyber-crimes, legal provisions available for victims, and the role of cyber-crime cells. Participants were guided on safeguarding personal information, identifying fraudulent online activities, and responding effectively to cyber threats.

The session encouraged open interaction, where participants actively engaged in discussions and clarified their doubts, making the program informative and impactful.
